The Pink Shirt Day Story

n 2007, Berwick Nova Scotia, after a new student at their school was bullied for wearing a pink shirt, two grade 12 students bought 50 pink shirts and encouraged their classmates to wear pink. The next day they went to distribute the shirts and to their surprise the majority of students arrived wearing pink! With that act of kindness, Pink Shirt Day was born.

In recognition of the Berwick event, Nova Scotia proclaimed the second Thursday of September "Stand Up Against Bullying Day." In 2008, British Columbia proclaimed February 27th to be the provincial anti-bullying day, and the movement has continued to grow. In 2012, the United Nations declared May 4 as Anti-Bullying Day, and now the last Wednesday each February is Canada's national Pink Shirt/anti-bullying day.

Many countries now recognize specific days for raising awareness about the prevention of bullying and promoting kindness and inclusion. In Canada, many students have heard the Pink Shirt Day message from kindergarten through to their high school graduation. The movement continues to grow.



Indigenous Education

Musical performance at BES by Metis singer, songwriter and storyteller Patrick Alexandre on Monday, February 26th from 1:30pm - 3:15 pm. Parents are welcome to attend. Below is a write-up about Patrick and his performance.

RedBoine by Patrick Alexandre Song by song, story by captivating story, Patrick Alexandre takes audiences through the tumultuous years of the Red River Resistance as seen through the eyes of his ancestors. His heartfelt songs offer an original and intimate perspective of Metis life resisting, fighting and dying in the days of Canada's Confederation.

Métis roots powerhouse singer Patrick Alexandre re-emerges from the recent hiatus with a soon to be released bilingual concept album exploring the various roles his ancestors played throughout the Red River Resistances of 1869. The Juno nominated producer, songwriter and multi-instrumentalist blends stories and songs, taking you on an emotional journey through Canadian history. The experiences of his ancestors provide a very human and personal perspective to a complex issue.

Using his unique blend of Folk, Blues, and Country music, Alexandre gets down into the gritty truths of the turmoil faced by his relatives and the people around them in a difficult and ever changing time, demonstrating the resilience and Joi de vivre the Métis People are known for.

This month our K-7's are focusing on the Grandfather Teaching of Love that is represented by the Eagle. Metis artist Phyllis Poitras-Jarrett describes eagle spirit and love as the following:

Eagle Spirit

I am the eagle spirit. I love all beings unconditionally and will embrace you with open wings. I will support you at your weakest and most joyful moments. My love knows no boundaries. I will protect you and guide you like I do my offspring. Love yourself and a peaceful flow will spread from your heart to those who cross your path. Soon gratitude and love will be mirrored back to you. Your vision will become clear knowing that love, kindness and peace is being spread across Mother Earth.
